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
# **GET COMPLIANT!**

#### KNOW YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD: MESTA PARK PRESERVATION REVIEW COMMITTEE

by Sam Stalcup Mesta Park is zoned as a Historic Preservation District. This designation means that significant changes to the exterior of our homes, as well as demolitions and new construction in the neighborhood require a Certificate of Appropriateness issued by the City of Oklahoma City's Historic Preservation Commission.

Regular maintenance and simple repairs do not require approval from the city, but a Certificate of Appropriateness is required if proposed work will result in changes to more than 50% of any architectural feature on any one side of the structure. All work done must conform to the standards set forth in Oklahoma City's Historic Preservation Design & Sustainability Standards and Guidelines, copies of which are available online or from the City of Oklahoma City. As part of this process, the Historic Preservation Commission empowers each neighborhood to appoint a Preservation Review Committee. In Mesta Park, our Preservation Review Committee has two key roles. The first is to provide assistance to property owners as they navigate the historic preservation process. The second is to represent the views of the neighborhood on business being considered by the Historic Preservation Commission.

#### CHANGES COMING TO THE NEWSETTER IN 2021 We Need Your Email Address to Make It Happen!

The Mesta Park newsletter has been a part of life in our neighborhood for as long as most residents can remember. It takes a lot of time and effort to produce the pages you receive every two months. We hope y'all have looked forward to getting the newsletter in the mail to catch up on things happening in the 'hood.

The Mesta Park Neighborhood Association has made the difficult decision to go digital with the newsletter starting with the first issue of the new year. The newsletter breaks even financially, but the thought is that without the expense of printing and distributing the physical newsletter we can keep more money to improve the neighborhood.

## This will only work though if we can increase the number of email addresses we have on file for residents (home owners and renters alike).

<u>Fun Fact</u>: There are approximately 800 doors (ie 800 residences) within our boundaries. We have email addresses for fewer than 10%. This transition needs to collect as many email addresses as possible for it to be successful. We would love to get *at least* HALF of our neighbors to send in an email address. This is not only to get the newsletter to everyone but to allow us to send informational emails about neighborhood events and updates on issues that come up.

We will never sell your email nor share it with anyone else. More importantly, we will not (I REPEAT ABSOLUTELY NOT) inundate you with too many emails, ever.

A second issue is the unknown future of fundraising and whether or not we can even put on our two main fundraisers this year, Mesta Festa and the Home Tour. We intend to at this time, but the future is very unsettled right now. Sponsors may be hard to attract this year, and visitors may not show up either. We encourage EVERY resident (owner and renter alike) to become a member of the neighborhood. It costs \$60 a year. For that \$5 a month (one latte a month), you help put on both Mesta Festa and the Home Tour plus an Easter Egg hunt with the Easter Bunny, an ice cream social, and a picnic.

In addition, your membership, along with funds from SSM (St Anthony's) and Heritage Hills, helps provide money for the upkeep of the Shartel Blvd median. We provided partial funding for the new volleyball courts and nets, new sod, and new sprinklers, and we continue to provide the water for the park (we pay the bills, not the city) and other improvements. No one on the board gets paid, so 100% of your tax-deductible membership goes to work improving the best neighborhood in OKC. That's why we live here, right?
